





His main research interests are in epidemiology and global mental health. He has conducted large scale community-based surveys, large randomized controlled trials, implementation research and research






psychotherapy. As a teacher, he is involved in inculcating the ideals of scientific rigor and evidence based medicine in Nigerian psychiatry, curriculum development and






























DR. ESTHER OSEMUDIAMEN OKOGBENIN
